We at the Dane County Housing Authority (DCHA) are reaching out to inform you of a resource we are excited to be bringing to the Dane County community. DCHA currently has an allocation of Mainstream Vouchers that were awarded in 2020. Mainstream Vouchers are tenant-based Housing Choice Vouchers specifically for households that include a non-elderly person (18 years of age or older but not yet 62) with disabilities. DCHA has partnered with Homeless Services Consortium, Movin' Out, and the Corporation for Supportive Housing to implement this program in Dane County.

In the application for these vouchers, DCHA committed to prioritizing households that either are currently homeless, are at serious risk of institutionalization, are transitioning out of an institutional or other segregated setting, or have previously experienced homelessness and are currently a client in a permanent supporting housing or rapid rehousing project.

These groups may have faced challenging housing circumstances recently and/or their disabilities may make it more difficult to find housing that can accommodate them, so we are thankful for the additional support our partnering agencies will be providing. However, we acknowledge that the rental market is competitive in Dane County and could pose a challenge to voucher holders trying to find a unit to rent with their voucher.

We are reaching out because we want to be able to give the individuals and families that have been issued a voucher as many resources as we can to assist in their housing search, which includes making sure our vacancy list is up to date. **Please consider filling out the attached Vacancy Listing Form and returning it to DCHA's Administrative Assistant Madelyn Gallegos at mgallegos@dcha.net to list any current or upcoming vacancies you may have.** There is a space on the form to indicate any accessibility features of your unit as well.
